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**HARNARESH SINGH GILL, J. (ORAL)**

The present criminal writ petition has been filed under Article 226 of Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus for directing respondents No. 2 and 3 to protect life and liberty of the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that the son of the petitioners namely Sham Sunder Mishra was involved in a bad company and had been disinherited from the immovable property of the petitioners. Learned counsel on instructions, further states that whatever act he is doing, the petitioners being his parents, are not responsible for his act and conduct. One Baljit Singh moved an application to SHO Nawanshahar that Sham Sunder Mishra (son) has taken some money from him in order to send him to abroad. The concerned police was summoning the petitioners time and again, though the petitioners are not involved in the present case.

The status report by way of affidavit has been filed by Deputy Superintendent of Police, Offences against Women and Children, SBS Nagar on behalf of respondents No. 3 to 5, in which it has been specifically

stated that the FIR No. 30 dated 06.02.2020 under Sections 406, 420 IPC has been registered at P.S.City Nawanshahar against Sham Sunder Mishra son of the petitioners and it has been further stated that the petitioners are not required by the police for any investigating purpose.

Keeping in view the above, since the petitioner are not required by the police in any case for any investigating purpose, the petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
