The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No. 15 dated 17.1.2017 under Section 420, 506 IPC, Police station City Faridkot.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has stated that on 01.05.2019, he could not appear in the Court since he was in Gujarat for his business and he came back on 24.7.2019 thereafter, again he could not appear 16.7.2019 before the Court in present FIR under Section 438 Cr.P.C. and that he never intended to remain absent from the Court.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner. Since 1.5.2019

petitioner is on run and he has not appeared before the learned trial Court therefore, there is no ground to grant any relief of anticipatory bail to the petitioner and therefore, prayer of the petitioner for grant of anticipatory bail is declined.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner on instructions undertakes to surrender before the trial Court on 27.01.2020. He prays that he will immediately move an application for bail before the trial Court. He further states that in case the application is moved, the same should be decided on the same day. This Court found force in the arguments of learned counsel for the petitioner. Consequently, in case the petitioner surrenders before the learned trial Court on 27.01.2020 and file the bail application, let the same be decided by the learned trial Court in accordance with law.

Disposed of accordingly.
