Through the instant petition, the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in FIR No.205 dated 27.03.2015, registered at Police Station City Palwal, District Palwal, under Sections 420, 406 and 120-B IPC.

On 13.12.2019, a Coordinate Bench of this Court passed the following order:

“Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.205 dated 27.03.2015 registered under Sections 420, 406 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 at Police Station City Palwal, District Palwal.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the case who had already resigned from the post of Managing Director of

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the Company on 05.01.2011. The insolvency proceedings against the Company have also been initiated in the National Company Law Tribunal. The petitioner is ready to join investigation and abide by all the terms and conditions of his bail.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Arjun Singh Yadav, Asstt. A.G., Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State. Copy of the paper book has been supplied to the Learned State Counsel, who seeks time to complete his instructions.

Adjourned to 10.02.2020.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation as and when called upon to do so. In the event of his arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail by the arresting officer/investigating officer on furnishing of bail bonds by him to the satisfaction of the arresting officer/investigating officer. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions enumerated under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C. failing which he shall not be entitled to the benefit of protection of interim bail allowed to him.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that pursuant to the order dated 13.12.2019 passed by the Coordinate Bench, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from Inspector Satya Narayan, submits that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for any further investigation.

Looking to the circumstances, but without commenting on the

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merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 13.12.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
