Through the instant petition, the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in FIR No.129 dated 19.04.2018, registered at Police Station Bhupani, District Faridabad, under Sections 406 and 420 IPC.

On 03.07.2018, a Coordinate Bench of this Court passed the following order:

“Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the company of the petitioner had received an amount of Rs. 1,85,46,402/- for supplying goods as per the agreement and orders to be placed by the complainant. The company of the petitioner had already delivered goods worth Rs.1,17,19,340/-. Qua the goods worth the remaining amount, the company of the petitioner had already requested the complainant to inspect the stock and take the delivery. However, the complainant is not coming forward to get the

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supply of the goods. Learned counsel submits that its a purely civil and commercial transaction, having no relevance with criminality.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioner be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds and surety to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that pursuant to the order dated 03.07.2018 passed by the Coordinate Bench of this Court, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Ish Kumar, submits that in the present case, cancellation report has been prepared and approved by the Superintendent of Police.

Looking to the circumstances, but without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 03.07.2018, granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
