The present petition has been filed seeking grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.207 dated 25.11.2019, under Sections 420, 506, 120-B IPC, Police Station Gidderbaha, District Shri Muktsar Sahib.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in the present case, as per the allegations contained in the FIR, the petitioner and other co-accused forcibly made the complainant to sign the sale deed after confining her. He has further stated that the petitioner was neither the beneficiary nor the signatory of the sale deed. He has also stated that it was basically a family dispute and the same has been amicably settled before the Mediation Centre.

On 19.12.2019, notice was issued in this case and in the

meantime, petitioner was directed to joint investigation and interim protection was granted to her by this Court.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Jaskaran Singh has stated that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is fully cooperating with the same. He has further stated that the petitioner is no longer required for custodial interrogation.

Mr. Lupil Gupta, Advocate, who has also put in appearance on behalf of the complainant, submitted that the matter has been amicably settled between the parties.

In view of the statement made by the learned State counsel and the stand taken by the learned counsel for the complainant, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 19.12.2019 passed by this Court, is hereby made absolute.
