Through the instant petition, the petitioners seek anticipatory bail in FIR No.172 dated 18.10.2019, registered at Police Station Gharinda, Amritsar Rural, District Amritsar, under Sections 380, 120-B and 109 IPC.

On 26.12.2019, a Coordinate Bench of this Court passed the following order:

“Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioners have been implicated in the FIR only for the reason that they have got married against the wishes of their parents.

Notice of motion for 06.02.2020.

Petitioners are directed to surrender before the police and join investigation within two weeks. In the event of their arrest being required, they shall be released on interim bail till the next date, subject to their furnishing bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, they shall abide by the terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 438

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(2)(i) to (iv) Cr.P.C, failing which the concession of interim bail shall stand cancelled.”

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that pursuant to the order dated 26.12.2019 passed by this Court, the petitioners have joined the investigation.

Learned counsel for the complainant submits that petitioner No.1, who is daughter of complainant and studying in 10+2 standard, had run away alongwith petitioner No.2 and she had also taken away Rs.6 lakh and gold ornaments weighing about 30 tolas from the house of complainant. She has also brought bad name to the family of complainant in the society.

The arguments advanced by the learned counsel for the complainant are not accepted.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Balwinder Singh, submits that the petitioners have joined investigation and are not required for any further investigation.

Looking to the circumstances, but without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 26.12.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
