Heard.

In the interest of justice, the petitioner is directed to be released on
parole for a period of four weeks from the date of his release on his
executing a personal bond in the sum of Rs.10,000/- with one surety in the
like amount to the satisfaction of the Jail Superintendent, subject to the
following conditions:

i) The petitioner shall provide his mobile phone number to the

- Jail Superintendent at the time of his release, which shall be kept in working conditions at all the times. The same shall not be changed without prior intimation to the Jail Superintendent;
- ii) The petitioner shall report at the local police station to mark his attendance on every alternate day at 11:00 a.m. during the period of parole;
 - iii) The petitioner shall duly surrender at the end of the period of parole; and
 - iv) The petitioner shall also not indulge in any criminal activity while on parole.

Learned Standing Counsel (Criminal) for the State submits that the petitioner should file proof of filing Special Leave Petition at the time of surrender before the Jail Superintendent.

Heard. Let the petitioner file the proof of having filed Special Leave Petition before Jail Superintendent at the time of surrender.

A copy of this order be communicated to the Jail Superintendent.

The petition stands disposed of.
