1. The hearing was conducted through video conferencing.
2. Petitioner impugns order dated 05.03.2020 whereby the Financial Commissioner has remitted the matter to the Excise Commissioner with the direction to re-examine the matter in the light of the existing laws, rules and regulations regarding the requirement of legal possession of premises as a mandatory requirement at the time of applying for a licence from the Excise Department.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in case directions are issued to the Excise Commissioner to expedite the hearing of the case and dispose of the same, petitioner shall not press his petition.
