2 13-12-2021 Let the defects, if any, be removed within four weeks
after complete start of the physical Court.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
Additional Public Prosecutor for the State.

The petitioner is apprehending his arrest in a case
registered for the offences punishable under Section 120B of the
Indian Penal Code and Section 30(a) of the Bihar Prohibition
and Excise Act.

Submission is that recovery is not alleged from
possession or house of the petitioner. The petitioner has got no
criminal antecedent.

Since the only material against the petitioner is
suspicion, let the petitioner, above named, in the event of his
arrest or surrender before the Court below within a period of



thirty days from the date of receipt of the order, be released on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 20,000/- (rupees twenty thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below where the case is pending in connection with Bhagwanpur P.S. Case No.80 of 2021, subject to the condition as laid down under Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure as well as subject to the following conditions:

(a) Both the bailors shall be the resident of territorial jurisdiction of the learned Court-below.

(b) The petitioner shall fully cooperate with the investigation/trial of the case, failing which the court below shall be at liberty to cancel the bail bond of the petitioner.

(c) The petitioner shall not leave the country without permission of the trial Court.
