Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned counsel for the State through video conference. Learned counsel for the petitioner undertakes that all defects pointed out by the Stamp Reporter shall be removed, and compliance with the conditions of the notices of this Court with regard to acceptance of e-filing shall be made, without delay immediately upon resumption of normal physical functioning of the Court, and in any event within one month thereof.

2. The writ petition has been filed "for issuance of a writ in nature of mandamus or any other appropriate writ/writs or order/orders or direction/directions or circular/circulars to the corresponding respondent, the Commissioner, Tirhut Division, Muzaffarpur (Respondent No. 2) for directing to dispose of P.D.S. Revision Case No. 51 of 2020 then and there which is pending in the Court of Commissioner, Tirhut Division, Muzaffarpur (Respondent No. 2) by which the petitioner is much aggrieved."

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the



petitioner has filed a revision being P.D.S. Revision Case No. 51 of 2020 before the Commissioner, Tirhut Division, Muzaffarpur (Respondent No. 2) against the appellate order of the Collector, Vaishali affirming the order of Sub-divisional Officer, Mahua cancelling the PDS Licence of the petitioner contained in memo no. 66 dated 20.01.2015, which however remains pending.

4. Learned counsel for the respondents appears and has been heard.

5. Having regard to the nature of the prayer of the petitioner, the writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the Commissioner, Tirhut Division, Muzaffarpur (Respondent No. 2) to consider and dispose of the P.D.S. Revision Case No. 51 of 2020, if still pending, on its own merit and in accordance with law after grant of opportunity of hearing to the petitioner, expeditiously and preferably within a period of two months from the date of receipt/production of a copy of this judgment. To enable disposal, the petitioner shall furnish his mobile number and email ID to the respondents within a week from today.

6. It is made clear that in view of the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, any correspondence between the parties may be made through email and the petitioner shall be at liberty to request for hearing through video conference.

7. Office shall follow-up to ensure that all defects are removed and compliance with the notices of this Court are made by the petitioner within the stipulated time provided in para 1 hereinabove, failing which the matter shall be brought to the notice of this Court.
