The petitioner seeks bail in connection with

Inarwa P. S. Case No. 79 of 2019 dated 31.12.2019,

instituted for offences under Sections 302 and 34 of the

Indian Penal Code.

On the orders of Sripati Devi and the petitioner



himself, the husband of the informant was assaulted. The petitioner is alleged to have assaulted the husband of the informant along with other persons, who succumbed to the injuries.

One lady, who also has been made accused along with the petitioner, has been granted bail.

There is no external injury on the person of the deceased but on dissection, the death was found to be homicidal and caused by the internal injuries suffered by the deceased.

The petitioner is in custody since 02.05.2020.

However, regard being had to the nature of accusation against the petitioner, I am not inclined to grant bail to him.

The petition is rejected.

However, if there is no substantial progress in the case before the court below within the next nine months, the petitioner would be at liberty to approach the trial court for grant of bail and in that event, the



court below shall be under an obligation to record the reasons for the tardy progress of the trial.
