ORAL ORDER

4 26-07-2021 Let the defects be removed within four weeks of the start of the physical Court.

Heard the parties in virtual Court.

The petitioner is languishing in custody for the offence punishable under Section 392 of the Indian Penal Code.

The F.I.R. of the occurrence of robbery is against unknown.

Submission is that neither the petitioner was put on T.I. parade during investigation of the case nor any incriminating article was recovered from his possession. Other co-accused has already been allowed bail by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court vide order at Annexure-2.

Considering the submission aforesaid, let the petitioner, above named, be released on bail on furnishing bail



bond of Rs.20000/- (Twenty thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Court-below where the case is pending in connection with Rosera P.S. Case No. 383 of 2019, with following conditions:

(a) Both the bailors shall be the resident of territorial jurisdiction of the learned Court-below.

(b) The petitioner shall fully cooperate with the trial of the case, failing which the court below shall be at liberty to cancel the bail bond of the petitioner.

(c) The petitioner shall not leave the country without permission of the trial Court.
