1. This is an application under Article 226 of the Constitution of India wherein the writ petitioner is aggrieved by the inaction on the part of the respondents in considering his representation dated December 18, 2020.

2. I have heard counsel appearing on behalf of the parties and perused the materials on record.

3. In light of the submissions made, I direct the concerned authorities to consider the representation of the petitioner and thereafter pass a reasoned order within ten weeks from date. The reasoned order should be communicated to the petitioner within a week of passing of the same.

4. With the above direction, the writ petition is disposed of. There will be no order as to costs.

5. Since no affidavit-in-opposition is called for, the allegations made in the writ petition are deemed not to have been admitted.
