Ashalata Pal Vs The State West Bengal & Ors.

Affidavit of service filed in Court today is kept with the record.

The petitioner's husband was an assistant teacher of a Primary School, who died-in-harness on 31.05.2000. The petitioner had completed all pension-related formalities just after death of her husband. However, the concerned authorities delayed and released arrear pension amount on 14.02.2003. The petitioner herein seeks interest to be paid on the arrear pension for the interim period of delay in receipt of the arrear pension.

There is a considerable delay in filing of the writ petition, which the petitioner seeks to justify by stating that there is no statutory period of limitation and neither parties have suffered due to this delay. It is the submission of the petitioner that accordingly the petition should be allowed.

The petitioner relies upon an order in **W.P. No. 17557 (W) of 2017 (Narayan Chandra Saha Vs. State of West Bengal & Ors.)** wherein a co-ordinate Bench had relied upon the Supreme Court judgement in the case of **Union of India Vs. Tarsem Singh**, reported in **(2008) 8 S.C.C. 648** on the issue of limitation relating to payment

or re-fixation of pay or pension wherein the Apex Court had held that relief may be granted in spite of delay as it does not affect the rights of the third party.

In view of the above and after hearing the learned Counsel for the petitioner, I direct the Director of Pension, Provident Fund and Group Insurance, Government of West Bengal as also the concerned Treasury Officer to pay interest to the petitioner @ 8% per annum on the arrear pension calculated from 01.06.2000 till the date of payment. Such payment is to be made within a period of eight weeks from the date of communication of this order.

The writ petition is disposed of without, however, no order as to costs.
