Despite service of notice, none appears on behalf of the State-respondents. Affidavit of service filed in Court today be kept with the record.

The learned Advocate for the petitioner submits that the petitioner's husband was an Executive Assistant of Mogra Gram Panchayat and he retired from service on 30.06.2011. He thereafter died on 02.01.2014. Pension Order was issued in favour of the petitioner on 18.05.2012 and the arrear pension of the petitioner was released on 11.07.2012.

Although the petitioner was entitled to payment of his pensionary benefit from the date of his retirement, the same was not paid. By presenting this writ petition, the petitioner prays for an order on the respondents to award interest on delayed payment of gratuity.

I have heard the learned Advocate for the petitioner and have also considered the orders passed by different Hon'ble Judges on the writ petitions involving similar issues.

In view thereof, this writ petition stands disposed of with a direction upon the respondents and particularly the concerned Treasury Officer to pay to the petitioner interest on gratuity as well as arrear pension @ 9% per annum from the date of retirement of the petitioner till the date of actual payment within

16 weeks from the date of service of an authenticated copy of this order failing which, additional interest @ 2% per annum shall be payable to the petitioner.

There shall be no order as to costs.
