In re : An Application for **anticipatory bail** under Section **438** of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with **Shyampur** Police Station Case No. **92** of **2020** dated **March 11, 2020** under Sections **376(A)(B)/ 448/ 323/ 325/ 354/ 506/ 34** of the Indian Penal Code, read with **Section 6** of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012.

Petitioners seek anticipatory bail.

Learned advocate appearing for the petitioners submits that the main accused died. The petitioners were falsely implicated.

Learned advocate appearing for the State draws the attention of the Court to the statements recorded under Section 164 of the Criminal Procedure Code of one of the persons who suffered injury.

Considering the statements recorded under Section 164 of the Criminal Procedure Code and the materials in the case diary, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on anticipatory bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) each with two sureties of like amount each, to the

satisfaction of the arresting officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that the petitioners shall appear before the Court below and pray for regular bail within four weeks from date and on further condition that the petitioners shall cooperate with the investigation of the case.

Prayer for anticipatory bail is **allowed**.

CRM 3661 of 2021 is **disposed of**.
