Petitioner seeks anticipatory bail.

Learned advocate for the petitioner submits that since police submitted charge sheet, custodial interrogation of the petitioner is not necessary.

Learned advocate for the State draws attention of this Court to the contents of the case diary.

Considering the involvement of the petitioner in the alleged crime and since police submitted charge sheet, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also subject to the conditions as laid down under section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973. Petitioner shall appear before the jurisdictional court and pray for regular bail within four weeks from date.

The application being CRM 3739 of 2021 is disposed of.
