three months from the date of communication of this order to the said tribunal.

With the aforesaid directions, C. O. No. 1198 of 2021 is disposed of accordingly.

The tribunal shall act on the communication of the learned advocate for the petitioner and/or server copy of this order without insisting upon prior production of a certified copy.

There will be no order as to costs.
