Although none appears on behalf of the petitioners, learned counsel appearing for the opposite party nos.1 and 2 appears and submits that the matter has become infructuous in view of the suit, from which the present revision arises, itself having been dismissed for default on March 2, 2018 and, to the best of the knowledge of the opposite party nos.1 and 2, no effort has been taken as yet by the plaintiff/petitioners to restore the said suit.
