In Re: - An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure filed on 09.11.2021 in connection with **Ranaghat** P.S. Case No. **206 of 2020** dated **01/10/2020** under Sections **341/195A/506** of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

Petitioners seek anticipatory bail.

Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioners submits that the petitioners were falsely implicated.

Learned Advocate appearing for the State draws the attention of the Court to the contents in the case diary.

Considering the nature of the offences and considering the extent and the involvement of the petitioners, we grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a Bond of Rs.10,000/- each with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on condition that the petitioners will not hold out any threat to the de facto complainant or her family members and on further condition that they shall meet the Investigating Officer once a month until further orders and

that they shall appear before the jurisdictional Court and pray for regular bail within four weeks from date.

The application for anticipatory bail being C.R.M. 7261 of 2021 is, thus, disposed of.
