CRM 7889 of 2021

In re : An Application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure filed on 23.11.2021 in connection with Nanoor Police Station Case No. 19 of 2021 dated 27.02.2021 under Sections 399/402 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25/27/35 of the Arms Act.

Having heard the learned Advocate appearing for the petitioner and the State and having considered the gravity of the offences, the complicity of the petitioner therein and having considered the fact that some of accused were granted anticipatory bail by the jurisdictional Court and some other co-accused were granted bail by the jurisdictional Court and having considered the fact that the police submitted charge-sheet, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only), with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and with a further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the jurisdictional Court and pray for regular bail within four weeks from date and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the jurisdictional Court on every date fixed for hearing.

The prayer for anticipatory bail is allowed.

CRM 7889 of 2021 is disposed of.
