The petitioner has filed the instant writ petition seeking a direction upon the respondent No. 4, the Block Land and Land Reforms Officer, Canning-I, to demarcate her plot of land under Section 56 of the West Bengal Land Reforms Act, 1955.

In view of the constitution of the West Bengal Land Reforms and Tenancy Tribunal Act, 1997, under Article 323-B of the Constitution of India, this Court lacks the jurisdiction to entertain the instant writ petition.

Accordingly, the writ petition, WPA 21624 of 2019 stands dismissed.
