This is an application under Article 226 of the Constitution of India wherein the writ petitioner is aggrieved by the inaction on the part of the respondent authorities in granting him higher pay scale on account of his acquiring Post-Graduate Degree.

I have heard counsel appearing on behalf of the parties and perused the materials on record.

In light of the above, the District Inspector of Schools (SE), Murshidabad is directed to grant an opportunity of hearing to the petitioner and thereafter pass a reasoned order within a period of four weeks from date. The reasoned order should be communicated to the petitioner within one week from the date of passing of the same.

With these observations, this writ petition stands disposed of.

Since, no affidavit-in-opposition has been called for the allegations made in the writ petition are deemed to have not been admitted by the respondents.

There will be no order as to costs.
