1. The Petitioner has moved this Court with the following prayers:

“10.1 That, this Hon'ble Court may kindly be pleased to allow the petition by quashing Annexure P/2, and

Annexure P/3 holding them to be illegal and ultra-vires, because it is against the existing provisions of section 16(3) and 49(7-A)(1) of C.G. Cooperative Societies Act, 1960 and also it be held that removal of petitioner before expiry of their term i.e. 5 years and appointing respondent no 4 is illegal and accordingly order Annexure P/5 are liable to be quashed and the petitioner be permitted to continue their term as per Annexure P/4.

10.2 That, this Hon'ble Court may kindly be pleased to grant any other relief/reliefs in favour of the petitioners, which the Hon'ble Court deemed fit & just in the facts and circumstances of the case, including awarding of the costs to the petitioners."

2. When the matter is taken up for consideration, the learned counsel for the Petitioner seeks for permission to withdraw the matter.
3. Permission is granted.
4. The writ petition stands dismissed as withdrawn.
