1. The Instant writ petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India has been preferred by the petitioner against the respondent No. 4- Station House Officer, Police Station Sarkanda to not pressurize him for compromise with the accused person and to provide a fair investigation.
2. Mr. Devendra Pratap Singh, Dy. A. G. and Mr. Satya Narayan Dewangan, Investigating Officer would submit that the final report/charge-sheet will be filed by tomorrow before the concerning Court.
