1. This matter was heard for some time. Noticing that the petitioner has a civil dispute with licensee/respondent No.6 with regard to the expiry of the contract of the license agreement dated 01/09/2008 between the two, we expressed our disinclination.

2. The petitioner seeks liberty to withdraw this petition so as to avail of a civil remedy against respondent No.6.

3. The learned Advocate appearing for respondent No.,6/licensee submits that as the license agreement with the petitioner has expired,

respondent No.6 would be open to resolve the dispute amicably or through arbitration since there is a clause of arbitration in the agreement.

4. This petition is, therefore, disposed off as withdrawn with liberty. All permissible legal remedies available to the parties, are kept open.
