In paragraph 8 of the consent terms it has been provided that the Application to waive off statutory period under Section 13(B)(2) of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 is made on 26.02.2021, the same obviously will be considered by the Family Court Judge in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Amardeep Singh Vs. Harveen Kaur reported in (2017) 8 SCC 746.

4. In this view of the matter, the Petition is disposed of in view of the consent terms which are taken on record and marked as Exhibit 'X' for identification.
