PRAYER: Criminal Original Petition is filed under Section 439 of Criminal Procedure Code to enlarge the petitioner on bail in Crime No.2453 of 2020 pending investigation on the file of the Respondent.

O R D E R

(The case has been heard through video conference)

Petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 08.01.2021 for the offence punishable under Section 7, 20(1) Cigarette and other TOBACCO Acts 2003 and 328 of IPC in Crime No.2453 of 2020, seeks bail.

2. The petitioner is the sole accused. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner was found in possession of 868 Kgs of banned tobacco products. Hence, a case has been registered against the petitioner.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is no way connected with the offence. He would further submit that co-accused in this case has already been released on bail. Hence, he seeks for grant of bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor would submit that the petitioner was found in possession of huge quantity of banned tobacco products. Hence, she opposed to grant bail to the

5. Considering the said facts and circumstances and also considering the period of incarceration suffered by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner subject to the following conditions:

(a) Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on condition to execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Madhavaram and on further conditions that:

(b) the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the learned Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar Card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity;

(c) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders.

(d) the petitioner shall not commit any offences of similar nature;

(e) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(g) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560];

(h) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.

6. With the above directions, this Criminal Original Petition is ordered.
