PRAYER: Criminal Original petition has been filed under Section 439 of Cr.P.C, prayed to enlarge the petitioner on bail in connection with the case in Cr.No.262 of 2021 pending investigation on the file of the respondent Police.

ORDER

The petitioner, who was arrested on 21.04.2021 and remanded to judicial custody for the offences under Sections 4(1)(aaa), 4(1)(b), 4(1-A) 6 & 11 of RS Rules, 2000 TNP Act in Cr.No.262 of 2021, on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner was found in possession of 105 litres of rectified spirit and the same was seized by the respondent Police and registered a complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is no way connected with the alleged offence and he has been falsely implicated in this case and the petitioner has been in jail from 21.04.2021 nearly 60 days. Therefore, he prays to grant bail to the petitioner. However, on instructions, the learned counsel further submitted that the petitioner, on his own volition, is ready and willing to contribute a sum of Rs.50,000/-.

4. The learned Government Advocate (CrI.Side) submitted that the petitioner is an habitual offender and that there are 15 previous cases pending as against him. Hence, he opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. Considering the period of incarceration suffered by the petitioner and also the present COVID-19 pandemic situation, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner subject to the following conditions:

(a) the petitioner shall make a non refundable deposit of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand only) to the credit of the Dean, Chengalpet Government Hospital, Chengalpet, for the treatment of the Covid-19 affected persons, without prejudice to his defence before the trial Court and the learned Judicial Magistrate, after perusing the challan/ receipt, shall accept the sureties furnished by the petitioner;

(b) the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) before the Superintendent of the Sub-Jail, Kancheepuram in which the petitioner is confined and on such execution the petitioner shall be released from prison;

(c) Within a period of four weeks after the release, the petitioner shall execute a bond for Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Kancheepuram;.

(d) In case of any difficulty in executing the said bond along with the sureties before the concerned Magistrate within the time stipulated above, the petitioner is permitted to file appropriate petition within a period of four week therefrom before the concerned Magistrate for extension of time for executing the bond along with sureties and if any such application is filed, the concerned Magistrate shall decide on the grant of extension of time for accepting the bond and sureties in accordance with law. Failing filing of any such application within the time prescribed above, the bail granted by this Court would stand automatically vacated.

(e) the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(f) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police, daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders;

(g) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(h) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(i) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(j) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
