Prayer:

Petition filed under Section 438 of Cr.P.C., seeking to grant anticipatory bail and to direct the release the petitioner on bail, in the event of his arrest by the respondent police in Crime No.426 of 2021 under Sections 143, 286, 337, 379 of IPC r/w. Section 3 and 6 of Explosive Substances Act, 1908 and Section 21(1) of Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 subject to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate, Perambalur.

O R D E R

The petitioner who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence under Sections 143, 286, 337, 379 of IPC r/w. Sections 3 and 6 of Explosive Substances Act, 1908 and Section 21(1) of Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 in Cr.No.426 of 2021 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner along with the other accused is alleged to have planted gelatin sticks for breaking rock from hill.

3.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution.

4.The learned Government Advocate submitted that the petitioner is arrayed as A2 in the case and that A1 in the case has died on the spot.



5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on her appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Perambalur, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only), with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Court concerned may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders;

(c) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
