PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

(The case has been heard through video conference)

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 465, 468, 471, 473 and 420 of IPC in Crime No.1312 of 2021, on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the defacto complainant/Village Administrative Officer of Muthal Sethi Village, on the instructions of the Revenue Divisional Officer, Mannargudi, along with the other official authorities inspected the Government Direct Purchase Centre at Keezhapalam, Mannargudi. On verification they found that the petitioners have produced fake adangal receipt and procured the paddy to the tune of Rs.1,84,000/- from the farmers and the same was sold to the District Direct Purchase Rice Centre for higher price. Hence, the law enforcing agency registered the case against these petitioners on the complaint made by the defacto complainant.



3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submits that the petitioners have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution and they have been falsely implicated in this case. He further submits that the petitioners are farmers. However, on instructions the learned counsel further submits that without prejudice to their defence and contentions, the petitioners on their own volition are willing to contribute a sum of Rs.50,000/- for the purpose of improving and maintaining the Government School i.e, GHS, Athikadai Government School, Koradachery, Thiruvavarur District, Tamil Nadu.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) opposed the grant of anticipatory bail by stating that the petitioners have produced fake adangal receipt and procured the paddy to the tune of Rs.1,84,000/- from the farmers and the same was sold to the District Direct Purchase Rice Centre for higher price. Hence, he vehemently opposed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Taking into consideration the submissions advanced on behalf of the petitioners and also the fact that the petitioners have willfully and on their own volition agreed to contribute a sum of Rs.50,000/- for charitable purpose, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned *Judicial Magistrate No.I, Mannargudi, Thiruvavarur District* on condition that each of the petitioners shall execute a separate bonds for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) each, with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioners shall make a non-refundable deposit of Rs.50,000/- to the credit of " The Chief Educational Officer, Thiruvavarur District, for the rehabilitation and improvement of the basic needs of the Government School i.e., GHS, Athikadai Government School, Koradachery, Thiruvavarur District, Tamil Nadu under necessary acknowledgment without prejudice to their defence before the trial court and submit proof of payment of the said amount before the aforesaid learned Judicial Magistrate, who after perusing the receipt/acknowledgment shall accept the sureties furnished by the petitioners

(b) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Court concerned may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(c) the petitioners shall report before the respondent police



daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter as and when required.

(d) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(e) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala* [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(g) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.

6. The Chief Educational Officer shall submit the necessary proof with regard to the expenditure incurred and works that were done for the improvement/rehabilitation of the schools in the District before the Director of School Education as and when such works are completed by utilising the money as ordered by this Court.
