PRAYER: Criminal Original Petition has been filed under Section 439 of Cr.P.C, prayed to enlarge the petitioner on bail concerned in Crime No.1144 of 2021 pending on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER

The petitioner who was arrested on 24.08.2021 and remanded to judicial custody for the offence under Section 20(2) of Cigarette and other Tobacco Products Act, 2003 and Section 328 of I.P.C in Crime No.1144 of 2021 on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2. Totally there are five accused in this case and the petitioner herein arrayed as A5. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner along with other accused were in possession of 70 bags of gutkha and 20 bundles of cool leaf and 30 bundles of C-1 Tobacco bundle. Hence, the law enforcing agency registered a case against the petitioners.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is no way connected with the alleged offence and he has been falsely implicated in this case and the petitioner has been in jail from 24.08.2021. However, on instructions, the learned counsel further submitted that the petitioner, without prejudice to his rights, on his own volition, is ready and willing to contribute a sum of Rs.30,000/- for the purpose of improving and maintaining the Government Schools. Therefore, he prays to grant bail to the petitioner.



4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent submits that there is no previous case pending as against the petitioner. He further submits that this Court had already granted bail to the co-accused persons in Crl.O.P.No.13303 of 2021 vide order dated 02.08.2021. However, he vehemently opposed for grant of bail to the petitioner.

5. Considering the period of incarceration suffered by the petitioner and there is no previous case pending as against the petitioner and this Court had granted bail to the co-accused persons, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions:

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate-1 Perambalur and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioner shall make a non-refundable deposit of Rs.30,000/- (Rupees Thirty Thousand only) to the credit of the Chief Educational Officer, Perambalur District for the rehabilitation and improvement of the basic Government School, under necessary acknowledgement, without prejudice to his defence before the trial Court and submit the proof of payment of the said amount before the aforesaid learned Judicial Magistrate, who after perusing the challan/ receipt/acknowledgement, shall accept the sureties furnished by the petitioner;

(b) the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(c) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police, daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders;

(d) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(e) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble



Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(g) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.

7. In the result, this Criminal Original Petition is ordered and the Chief Educational Officer shall submit the necessary proof with regard to the expenditure incurred for the improvement/rehabilitation of the Schools in the District before the Director of School Education as and when such works are completed by utilising the money as ordered by this Court
