ORDER

The petitioner who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 16.08.2021 for the offences punishable under Sections 294(b), 307 IPC and 25(1-B) (a) and 27(1) of Arms Ac 1959, in Crime No.80 of 2021, on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner is the husband of the defacto complainant, there was family dispute between them. Further, the petitioner in a drunken mood and abused his wife and son, due to this a wordy quarrel between them, the petitioner took a country made gun from inside of the room and with an intent to kill their son, the petitioner shot against their son, but he escaped from the said shot. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is not involved in the offence and he has been falsely implicated. He further submits that he is in jail from 16.08.2021. Hence he prays for grant of bail to the petitioner.



4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent submitted that no one was sustained injuries. However, he vehemently opposed for grant of bail to the petitioner.

5. Considering the fact that no one was sustained injuries and there is no previous case pending as against the petitioner and also considering the period of incarceration suffered by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No. I, Salem, and on further condition that:

(a) the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police, daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders;

(c) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
