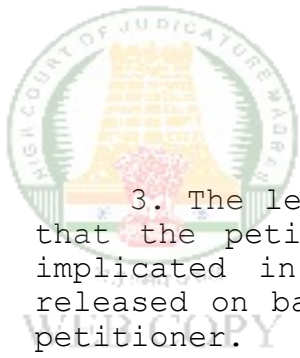

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has been falsely implicated in this case. He further submits that A1 is already released on bail. Hence, he prays to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. side) submits that the injured has been discharged from the hospital and the investigation is almost completed. Hence, he opposed for granting anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, the injured has been discharged from the hospital and the investigation is almost completed, this Court inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on anticipatory bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate Court - I, Udumalpet, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and



(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
