PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.573 of 2020 on the file of the
Respondent Police

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/A-1 apprehending arrest at the hands of the
respondent police for the offences punishable under sections 448,
294(b), 323, 324 and 506(ii) of I.P.C., in Crime No.573 of 2020 on
the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to political motive
between the petitioner herein and the defacto complainant, the
petitioner along with other accused persons said to have illegally
entered into the house of the defacto complainant and abused him
using filthy language and assaulted and also made life threat to
him. Hence, the complaint.



3. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (criminal side) appearing for the respondent.

4. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that due to political motive between the parties he has been falsely implicated in this case and the co-accused has been granted anticipatory bail by this Court in Crl.O.P.(MD)No.11755 of 2020 dated 29.10.2020. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail.

5. The learned Government Advocate (criminal side), on instructions, submitted that the injuries are simple in nature.

6. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and considering the fact that the injuries are simple in nature and the co-accused has been granted anticipatory bail, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or his appearance, within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.III, Thoothukudi, and on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that,

(a)the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b)the petitioner shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation.

(c)the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d)the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e)on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;



(f) if the accused/petitioner thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
