PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime no. 102 of 2021 on the file of the respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who is the sole accused, apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Section 307 of IPC, in Crime No.102 of 2021 on the file of the respondent Police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner and the defacto complainant was in love with each other. The petitioner's brother and the sister of the defacto complainant had married six months prior. Thereafter, the petitioner communicated with the victim girl and had developed love affair and both of the them have decided to get married. While that being so, there was a betrothal was completed between the defacto complainant with another person viz., Chinraj. Due to which, in a bit of anger and spur of the moment, the petitioner was said to have attacked the defacto complainant's neck with knife and caused injuries. Hence, the present complaint.



3. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent.

4. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that the petitioner has deep love with the defacto complainant and he is ready to take care of the defacto complainant. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail.

5. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent police submitted that the injured person has already been discharged from the hospital.

6. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the fact that the injured person has already been discharged from the hospital, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or his appearance, within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the Judicial Magistrate Court No.III, Tiruchirappalli, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation.

(c) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme

(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
