PRAYER : Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying for the issue of a Writ of Habeas Corpus, calling for the entire records connected with the detention order passed in H.S (M)Confdl. No.45/2021 dated 24.03.2021, on the file of the second respondent herein and quash the same and direct the respondents to produce the detenu or body of the detenu namely the petitioner's son i.e., Muthukumar @ Maduraimuthu, aged about 31 years, S/o.Balakrishnan Aasari, now detained at the Central Prison, Palayamkottai, before this Court and set him at liberty forthwith.

O R D E R

(Order of the Court was made by V. BHARATHIDASAN, J.)

This Habeas Corpus Petition has been filed by mother of the detenu, namely, Muthukumar @ Maduraimuthu, aged about 31 years, challenging the detention order in H.S(M)Confdl.No.45/2021 dated 24.03.2021, passed by the second respondent, branding him as "Goonda", as contemplated under Section 2(f) of Tamil Nadu Act 14 of 1982.

2.Heard the learned counsel on either side and perused the materials available on record.

3.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the original remand order has not been furnished to the petitioner, enabling him to make an effective representation before the authorities, which vitiate the detention order and hence the same is liable to be set aside.

4.The learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the state, on verification of records also admitted the fact that the original remand order was not furnished to the petitioner.

5.Considering the facts and circumstances, since the original remand order which is the document relied upon by the detaining authority has not been furnished to the petitioner, which prejudice his right to file an effective representation and hence, in our considered view, the detention order is liable to be set aside.

6. In fine, the Habeas Corpus Petition is allowed. The detention order in H.S(M)Confdl.No.45/2021 dated 24.03.2021, passed by the second respondent, is set aside. Consequently, the detenu, namely, Muthukumar @ Maduraimuthu, S/o.Balakrishnan Aasari, aged about 31 years, who is now detained at Central Prison, Palayamkottai, is directed to be released forthwith, unless his presence or custody or detention is required in connection with any other case.

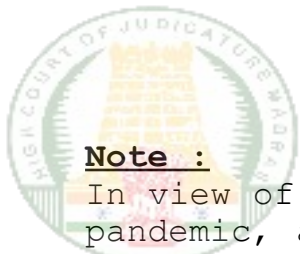
