PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.180 of 2021 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 294(b), 323, 324 and 506(ii) of IPC and Section 4 of Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act, 1988 in Crime No.180 of 2021, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the defacto complainant and her family members were about to construct a compound wall in



front of the petitioners' house, due to which, the petitioners assaulted the defacto complainant, abused her in filthy language and threatened her with dire consequences. Hence, the complaint.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons, they are not involved in the offences mentioned in the complaint and a false case has been foisted against them. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail for the petitioners.

4.The learned Government Advocate submitted that there are totally four accused in the present case and that the injured is discharged from the Hospital on 05.05.2021. He strongly opposed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5.Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and the learned Government Advocate appearing for the respondent.

6.It is seen from the submissions made that the injured is discharged from the Hospital and in such circumstances, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

7.Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Illupur on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees fifty thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

[a]the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b]the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police as and when required.

[c]the petitioners are directed to deposit a sum of Rs.500/- (Rupees Five Hundred only) each to the credit of IOB, Secretariat Branch, Chennai-9 (Account No.11720 10000 00070, IFSC Code: IOBA0001172), within a period of two weeks without prejudice to their rights and contentions before the trial Court;

[d]the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[e]the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.



[f]On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[g]If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
