PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.82 of 2021 on the file  
of the respondent Police

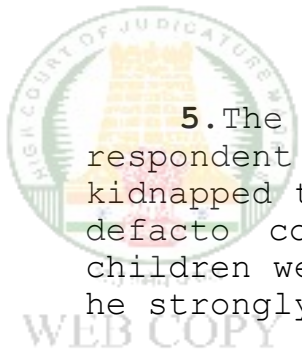
ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/Sole Accused, who apprehend arrest at the hands  
of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under  
Section 363 of I.P.C., in Crime No.82 of 2021 on the file of the  
respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

**2.**Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned  
Government Advocate (Criminal Side) for the respondent police.

**3.**The case of the prosecution is that due to family dispute,  
the petitioner kidnapped the defacto complainant's daughters.  
Hence, the complaint.

**4.**The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the  
defacto complainant is the elder sister of the petitioner's wife and  
there is a family dispute between the petitioner and his wife. He  
would further submit that the petitioner is innocent and a false  
case has been foisted against him. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail  
to the petitioner.



5.The learned Government Advocate(Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent would submit that due to previous enmity, the petitioner kidnapped the defacto complainant's daughters, who are in custody of defacto complainant's sister. He would further submit that the children were recovered and handed over to their parents. Therefore, he strongly opposes to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

6.Taking into consideration the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

7.Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or his appearance, within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Andipatti, Theni District and on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

(a)the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar cards or Bank pass Books to ensure their identity;

(b)the petitioner is directed to deposit a sum of Rs.1,000/- (Rupees One Thousand only) to the credit of IOB, Secretariat Branch, Chennai-9 (Account No.11720 10000 00070, IFSC Code: IOBA0001172), within a period of two weeks without prejudice to their rights and contentions before the trial Court;

(c)the petitioner shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation ;

(d)the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(e)the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f)on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]**; and

(g)if the accused/petitioner thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
