PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

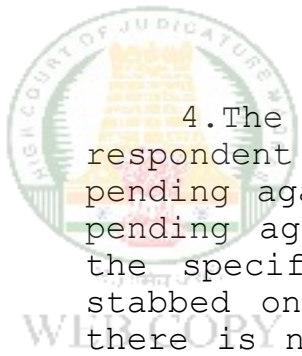
PRAYER :- For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.100 of 2021 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 294(b), 323, 324, 506(ii) & 307 IPC in Crime No.100 of 2021, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that due to some dispute, the petitioners and other accused attacked the defacto complainant and caused injuries to him. Hence, the complaint.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and they did not commit any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that A2 and A3 were arrested and subsequently released on bail by this Court vide order dated 05.05.2021 made in Crl.O.P.(MD)No.6556 of 2021. Therefore, he seeks anticipatory bail to the petitioners.



4.The learned Government Advocate(Crl.side) appearing for the respondent police submitted that there are three previous cases pending against the first petitioner and there is no previous case pending against the second petitioner. He further submitted that the specific overt act against the first petitioner is that he stabbed on the stomach of the defacto complainant with knife and there is no specific overt act against the second petitioner. He also submitted that the injured person has been discharged from the hospital.

5.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the fact that the co-accused were arrested and released on bail by this Court vide order dated 05.05.2021 made in Crl.O.P. (MD)No.6556 of 2021, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

6.Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Melur on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees One Lakh only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

[a]the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b]the petitioners are directed to deposit a sum of Rs.5,000/- (Rupees Five Thousand only)each to the credit of Indian Overseas Bank, Secretariat Branch, Chennai-9 (Account No.11720 10000 00070, IFSC Code: IOBA0001172), within a period of two weeks without prejudice to their rights and contentions before the trial Court.

[c]the petitioners shall report before respondent police as and when required.

[d]the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[e]the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[f]On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the



learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.

[g]If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
