PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-For Anticipatory Bail in Crime.No.351 of 2021 on the file of the respondent police

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Section 379 IPC in Crime No.351 of 2021, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that on 24.06.2021, at about 21 hours, the respondent police found a tipper tempo bearing registration No.TN74AS5691 near Vellankode park junction. They stopped the said vehicle. After stopping the vehicle, the driver escaped from there. 45 sacks of sand, worth about Rs.4,500/- was found in the said vehicle. Hence, the complaint.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person. In fact, the sand was donated by one Chandrakumar, after completing his house work for the purpose of temple kumbabishekam. In this regard, he produced the copy of the resolution passed by the temple Authority.

4.The learned Government Advocate(Crl.side) appearing for the respondent police opposed this petition on the ground that



investigation is pending. However, he conceded that sand was taken for temple kumbabishekam.

5. Taking note of the submissions and the facts of the case and also the material produced by the learned counsel for the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Kuzhithurai, Kanyakumari District, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner is directed to deposit a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) to the credit of Advocate Clerk's Welfare Association, Madurai-625 023 (Indian Bank Savings Account No.496039124, IFSC Code: IDIB000H040), within a period of two weeks without prejudice to their rights and contentions before the trial Court and produce the receipt/acknowledgment before the concerned Court while executing sureties;

[c] the petitioner shall report before respondent police daily at 10.30 am., until further orders.

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[e] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[f] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.

[g] If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
