PRAYER: Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying for the issuance of a Writ of Mandamus, directing the respondents to release the petitioner Two Wheeler Vehicle bearing Reg.No.TN-65-AU-7288 which was seized by the 2nd respondent on 28.05.2021 in pursuance to the registration of case in Crime No.83 of 2021, on the file of the 2nd respondent forthwith in accordance with law by considering the representation, dated 09.07.2021.

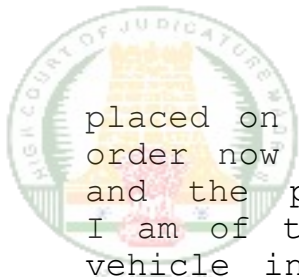
O R D E R

This Writ Petition has been filed praying for issuance of a Writ of Mandamus, to direct the respondents to release the petitioner's vehicle viz. Two Wheeler, bearing Reg.No.TN-65-AU-7288, which was seized by the 2nd respondent on 28.05.2021, in pursuance to the registration of case in Crime No.83 of 2021, on the file of the 2nd respondent forthwith, in accordance with law, by considering the representation of the petitioner, dated 09.07.2021.

2. Mr.P.Thilak Kumar, learned Government Advocate takes notice for the respondents.

3. The petitioner's vehicle was seized in connection with illegal transportation of 30 liters of Toddy Liquor. The enquiry in this regard is still pending. The learned counsel for the petitioner affirms before this Court that the petitioner's vehicle was not involved in any previous incident of similar nature.

4.The submission of the learned counsel for the petitioner is

placed on record. If this submission turns out to be false, the order now passed by this Court would stand automatically recalled and the petitioner will be visited with serious consequences. I am of the view that no purpose will be served by keeping the vehicle in question in the custody of the respondents. If the vehicle is kept in open space and exposed to sun light and rain, it would lose its value. Therefore, the respondents are directed to release the said vehicle subject to the following conditions.

5 Accordingly, this Writ Petition is disposed of with the following directions.

"(i)The petitioner is directed to deposit a sum of Rs.5,000/- (Rupees Five Thousand Only) to the credit of Government of Tamil Nadu, CMPRF in IOB, Secretariat Branch, Chennai-9 (Account No.11720 10000 00070, IFSCCode: IOBA0001172), without prejudice to his rights and contentions;

(ii)The petitioner is directed to produce all the documents pertaining to the ownership of the seized vehicle.

(iii)The petitioner is directed to file an affidavit of undertaking that he will cause production of the vehicle in question before the competent/concerned respondent (as the case may be) as and when called for and further, he will not alienate the vehicle in question till the appropriate proceedings initiated are completed;

(iv) On compliance of the above conditions, the respondent concerned is directed to release the seized vehicle, viz. Two Wheeler, bearing Reg.No.TN-65-AU-7288 , to the petitioner.

(v)The first respondent is directed to pass final orders in the adjudication proceedings, if any, within a period of 45 days;

(vi)This order for the release of the vehicle can be pressed into service by the petitioner only if the vehicle is not in the custody of the criminal Court. If the vehicle is in the custody of the concerned criminal Court of appropriate jurisdiction, then option is given to the petitioner to approach the concerned Judicial Magistrate to get release of the vehicle, by filing necessary application in the manner known to law and in accordance with law; and

(vii)Inasmuch as the vehicle viz. Two Wheeler, bearing Reg.No.TN-65-AU-7288, is seized by the second



respondent on 28.05.2021, the aforesaid order is to be complied with within a period of one week, if no order of adjudication is passed as on today.
