PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory bail in Crime No.474 of 2021 on the file of the Respondent police.

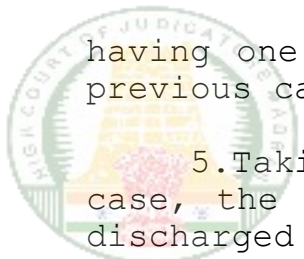
ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners/A1 & A3, apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 341, 294(b), 324 and 506(ii) I.P.C, in Crime No.474 of 2021 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that on 01.08.2021 at about 3.40 p.m, the petitioners had beaten the defacto complainant and abused him in filthy language. Hence, the complaint.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners are innocents, they have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution, but they have been falsely implicated in this case.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent police, on instructions, would submit that it is a case in counter. Both sides have suffered injury and the victim has been discharged from the hospital. However, the first petitioner is



having one previous case and the second petitioner is having three previous cases.

5. Taking into consideration the facts and circumstances of the case, the fact that it is a counter case and the injured has been discharged from the hospital, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions. Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Melur, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

(a) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the learned Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity;

(b) the first petitioner/A1 shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m until further orders. The second petitioner/A3 shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m and 05.30 p.m until further orders.

(c) the petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]**; and;

(f) if the accused/ petitioners thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
