PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.439 of Cr.P.C.

PRAYER :-For Bail in Crime No.505 of 2021 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who was arrested on 23.09.2021 for the offence punishable under Section 399 of IPC in Crime No.505 of 2021 on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner and other accused were planning to commit dacoity. Further two knives and two iron rods were also recovered from them. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the earlier petition filed by the petitioner in Crl.OP(MD)No.15814 of 2021 for bail was dismissed on 12.10.2021, on the ground that the petitioner has three previous cases. However, he would submit that all the previous cases are simple in nature.

4. Heard the learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the respondent police.

5. Considering the fact that the previous cases are simple in nature and the period of incarceration, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees twenty five thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate, Karaikudi, Sivagangai District and on further condition that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police daily at 10.30 a.m. for a period of thirty days.

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
