PRAYER: Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, to issue a writ of mandamus directing the respondent to pay the petitioner interest at the rate of 6% per annum for the period of delay from 01.05.2020 to 01.06.2021 in paying the amounts paid towards the petitioner's terminal and pension benefits namely EPF Employees Contribution, Gratuity and Encashment of Earned/Sick Leaves, within a time stipulated by this Court and without affecting his right to claim balance amount towards those benefits.

O R D E R

The prayer in this writ petition is for issuance of a writ of mandamus directing the respondent to pay interest at the rate of 6% per annum for the delay period i.e. from 01.05.2020 to 01.06.2021 in paying the petitioner's terminal and pension benefits namely EPF Employees Contribution, Gratuity and Encashment of Earned/Sick Leaves, within a time stipulated by this Court and without affecting his right to claim balance amount towards those benefits.

2. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Standing Counsel appearing for the respondent.



3. The petitioner is a retired employee of the respondent Transport Corporation. He retired from service on 30.04.2020. The respondent has settled the retirement benefits to the petitioner only in the month of June, 2021.

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4. According to the petitioner, the issue involved in the present writ petition is that the respondent has settled the aforesaid amount belatedly, after a delay of more than one year and they have also not paid interest for the belated payment to the petitioner. Hence, the petitioner has made a representation to the concerned Authorities to pay interest for the belated payment. The petitioner has also relied on the decision of the earlier writ petition of this Court in **W.P. (MD) No.19950 of 2020 dated 04.01.2021, J. Gurumoorthy vs TNSTC (Kumbakonam) Ltd.** In the above referred decision, this Court has fixed the rate of interest at 6% per annum for the belated payment of retirement benefits. On the same line, orders to be in the present writ petition.

5. The learned Standing Counsel appearing for respondent would submit that the respondent has settled the retirement benefits to the petitioner belatedly. Therefore, the petitioner is entitled for interest as decided in the earlier writ petition of this Court in W.P.(MD).No.19950 of 2020.

6. In the light of the above observations and with the consent of both parties, there shall be a direction to the respondent to pay the penal interest at the rate of 6% per annum on the belated payment of the retirement benefits for the period from the date of the retirement till the date of actual disbursement, as expeditiously as possible and in any event, within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, subject to the condition that if the petitioner has not already given up his right for claiming interest for the retirement benefits.

7. Accordingly, the writ petition is allowed. No costs.

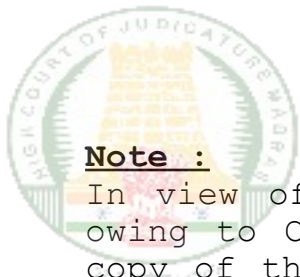
