PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C
PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.205 of 2021 on the file of
the respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the
respondent police for the alleged offence punishable under Section
379 IPC r/w Section 21(1) of the Mines and Minerals (Development and
Regulation) Act, 1957 in Crime No.205 of 2021, seek anticipatory
bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioners have been
in illegal possession of one unit of gravel. Therefore, the present
case came to be registered.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the
petitioners are innocents and they have been falsely implicated in
this case.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Crl Side) appearing for the
respondent police submitted the petitioners have taken one unit
gravel and they have not involved in any other case.



5.Considering the nature of mineral and the antecedent of the petitioners, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners. Accordingly, this criminal original petition is allowed. The petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Alangudi on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

[a]the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the learned Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity.

[b]the petitioners shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 am., until further orders.

[c]the petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d]the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e]On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner are released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.

[f]If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
