PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.195 of 2021 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners/Accused Nos.1 to 3, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 294(b), 323 and 506(ii) I.P.C., and Section 4 of Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act, 2002 in Cr.No.195 of 2021, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to some wordy quarrel between the defacto complainant and the petitioners, the petitioners



abused the defacto complainant and his mother by using filthy language and also attacked them by using wooden-stick and caused simple injuries to them. Hence, the present complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners are innocent and a false case has been foisted against them. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) would submit that the petitioners and the defacto complainant are neighbours and there was a wordy quarrel between the parties and the injured was discharged from the hospital on 26.10.2021 and the petitioners had no previous case.

5. Considering the facts that there arose a neighbourhood dispute between the parties, that the injured was discharged from the hospital on 26.10.2021 and that except the offences under Section 506(ii) I.P.C., and Section 4 of TNPHW, other offences are bailable in nature and also considering the fact that the petitioners had no previous cases as stated by the learned Government Advocate (Crl. side), this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of their arrest or their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No. II, Tirunelveli, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five thousand only) each with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

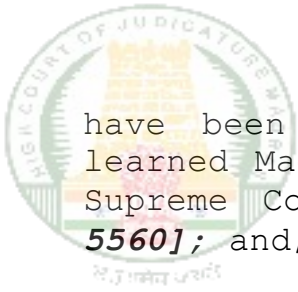
(a) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioners shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., for period of one month and thereafter as and when required for interrogation.

(c) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions



have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]**; and;

(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
