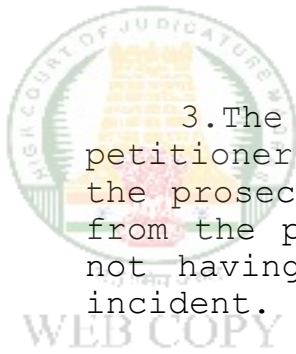
PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL UNDER SEC.438 OF CR.P.C

PRAYER :-For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.1336 of 2021 on the file of the respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners/Accused Nos.1 & 2, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 342 and 506(i) IPC, in Crime No.1336 of 2021, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that there was money transaction dispute between the parties and due to that, on 08.11.2021 at about 03.30PM, the petitioner took the mobile phone and bike key of the *defacto* complainant and went to her home, immediately, the *defacto* complainant also followed to her home, at that time the petitioner dragged the *defacto* complainant into her home and there the accused persons had threatened the *defacto* complainant and obtained a letter that she would return the money of Rupees three lakhs, within three months. Hence, the complaint.



3.The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners are innocent and not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution and that the *defacto* complainant only borrowed loan from the petitioner. He would also submit that the petitioners are not having any previous case and that no one was injured in the incident.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent would submit that there was money transaction dispute between the parties and that the investigation is not yet completed. He would further submit that no one was injured in the occurrence and that the petitioners are not having any previous case.

5.Considering the facts that there existed money transaction dispute between the parties, that no one was injured in the incident, that except the offence under Sections 506(i) IPC, the other offence is bailable in nature and the petitioners are not having any previous case for similar or serious offence, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.VI, Madurai, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) each with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

a)the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b)the petitioners shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 am for a period of one month and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.

(c)the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d)the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e)on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme

(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
