1. Order dated 08.02.2021 has been passed by the Registrar of the University accepting the claim of the petitioner. The same is taken on record. Copy thereof supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner, who states that in the circumstances, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the contempt petition and the same may be disposed of as not pressed at this stage while directing the respondent to release the benefits as per entitlement within a stipulated period of time with liberty to the petitioner to move an application for revival of the Contempt Petition if the circumstances of the case so warrant.

2. As mutually agreed by learned counsel for the parties, the respondent shall release benefits to the petitioner as per his entitlement in terms of order dated 09.09.2020 in CWP No.13977 of 2020 within six months' from today.

3. In view of the position as noted above, instant Contempt Petition is disposed of as not pressed at this stage while directing the respondent to release benefits to the petitioner as per his entitlement in

terms of order dated 09.09.2020 in CWP No.13977 of 2020 within six

months’ from today with liberty to the petitioner to move an application for revival of the Contempt Petition if the circumstances of the case so warrant. Needless to mention, in the eventuality of an application for revival of the contempt petition being filed, a serious view would be taken in the matter.
