Challenge in the present writ petition, filed under Article 227 of the Constitution of India, is to the order dated 06.09.2019 (Annexure P-5) whereby the warrant of attachment was issued for the land which was put on sale on account of the fact that an award had been passed by the MACT, Sirsa on 04.01.2016, for Rs.10,47,500/- along with interest @ 7.5% per annum from the date of the filing of the petition.

Vide the said award, the respondents who are the sons of the petitioner, were jointly and severally liable to pay the compensation. Respondent No.3-Kapoor Singh, who was the owner of the vehicle, was given the right to recover the same from the sons of the petitioners. The attachment has been done by the Executing Court on the ground that the land is ancestral and the sons also have a share in it.

After arguing for some time, counsel submits that he may be given liberty to withdraw the present petition and file objections before the Executing Court, in pursuance of his remedies available under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908.

Keeping in view the above, the present revision petition stands dismissed as not pressed, with the liberty aforestated.
